ABSENCE DECLARATION (Conflict Minerals)

The following statement is valid for products:

- POM OMNIACETAL C natural and black**
- PA6 AKULON 6 natural and black**
- PA6.6 AKULON 6.6 natural and black**

Based on the certifications received by our raw materials' suppliers, we confirm the compliance with the Section 1502 of the US law known as the "Dodd-Frank Act" and with Regulation (EU) 2017/821 of the European Parliament.

The definition of conflict minerals as per the Dodd-Frank Act includes the following materials and their derivatives: columbite-tantalite (tantalum), cassiterite (tin), wolframite (tungsten) and gold.

Cobalt was added on December 21, 2018, as the trade in cobalt potentially involves human rights violations.

Mica was added on October 28, 2020, to prevent child labor.

Companies using these minerals must make efforts to determine if those materials came from the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) or an adjoining country and, if so, to carry out a "due diligence" review of their supply chain to determine whether their mineral purchases are funding armed groups in eastern DRC.

Our raw materials suppliers In suspected cases, as stated in their policies, track the origins of minerals – as defined in the Dodd-Frank Act and in Regulation (EU) 2017/821 to see if they come from mines in conflict regions. they reserve the right to conduct an external audit and, if necessary, terminate their business relationship.

This declaration expires only in case of amendment of the law.

In this case we will issue a new document and it will be sent to our customers by the right time.
